Student-Operated Motor Vehicles

Students who have a valid Vermont motor vehicle operator's license may request permission to bring a vehicle on school grounds. Any such requests must have written consent from the student's parents or legal guardian. Such permission may be granted by the principal or his designee.

Careless use of motor vehicles on school property or the immediate vicinity as well as unauthorized use of vehicles during school time will result in the loss of the privilege of bringing vehicles on school property. Further, students who operate a motor vehicle in an illegal or dangerous matter will be referred to appropriate authorities for prosecution.

Motor vehicles shall be parked only in designated parking areas. Students are not to remain in automobiles after they are parked nor at any time during the school day without permission from school officials.

When there is not enough parking space for all students wishing to do so to park on school property, some students may not be permitted to park on school grounds. Students will be given priority for parking on school property based upon the following criteria:

1. Students with handicapping conditions which impair their mobility.
2. High school students for whom school bus transportation is not provided.
3. Students attending less than the full school day.
4. Students participating in extra-curricular activities which preclude riding on a school bus.
5. Preference in assigning parking spaces will be based upon grade level with 12 grade being the first priority.
