We are pleased to announce that South Royalton One Planet Summer Camp registration is now open! One Planet, with the support of South Royalton School and the Town of Royalton, is offering a full-day program with rich and varied summer activities for students **currently** in grades K-6. The program will run June 24 – Aug 2, 8:30-4:30pm. Childcare will be available one hour before and after the program. \$120/week-\$135/week will include fun theme-related activities, field trips, breakfast, lunch, a daily snack, special events, and more! Child care subsidy and scholarships are available.

LIMITED SPACE: We do expect to fill all of our available slots this summer, so if you are interested in enrolling your child, **please do not wait!** We will open enrollment to non-residents starting May 1st. In addition, if you enroll your child and pay 50% by May 1st, you will get \$5/week off!

SWIMMING LESSONS: We will return to UVAC again this year, July 1 - July 12. ***As in the past, students who enroll for both weeks will be given priority over those who enroll for only one week should we meet our maximum enrollment.*** Please note there will be no summer camp on Independence Day (Thursday, July 4th).

Please **CAREFULLY READ** the information provided as it outlines the registration procedures and program policies, as well as details about the exciting weekly programs. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact us. We look forward to working with your children this summer!

SOUTH ROYALTON SUMMER PROGRAM 2019

REGISTRATION DETAILS: PLEASE Read Carefully

REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM: Open to children who are **currently completing** K-6th grade. Royalton residents have priority until May 1st. **Non-residents cannot receive scholarships.** We consider Royalton residents to be children who live in Royalton year-round or during the summer months.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES: Opens March 2019 and ends when program has 45 enrolled or June 3rd. Forms will be processed in the order they are received. Drop off or mail registration forms and payment to Tara Tucker at the South Royalton School, 223 S Windsor Street, South Royalton, VT 05068.

REGISTRATION POLICIES:

1. ***Half of total summer payment must be sent with registration form to secure a spot for your child. The second half of the payment must be received by June 3rd, 2019. Please contact Tara Tucker about alternative payment structures.***
2. Registration Forms must be complete. *Participants with incomplete forms will be put on a waiting list and parent/guardian will be notified.*

CANCELLATION POLICY: If your child will not be able to attend a week for which he/she is registered, please notify Tara as soon as possible so that children on the waiting list can be notified. If cancellation is made by June 3rd, the camp fee will be returned in full, minus \$25 processing fee. If cancellation is made after that time, we will be unable to issue any refund and families who receive Child Care Financial Assistance will be charged the weekly rate. **PLEASE NOTE: Due to the currently subsidized registration fee, we do not provide refunds for days which your child does not attend camp.**

SWIMMING LESSONS: Daily swimming lessons will occur July 1 - 12 at Upper Valley Aquatic Center. If you do NOT want your child to participate in swimming lessons, please do NOT enroll him/her for those weeks, as that will be a central piece of our programming. We will also give priority to participants who enroll in both weeks of lessons. Please note there will be no summer camp on Thursday, July 4th.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE: If you cannot afford the summer fee, we ask families to first apply for Child Care Assistance through the Family Place, 802-649-3268. Please do this well in advance (by mid-May). If your family does not qualify for state assistance, please refer to the Financial Assistance form for more information.

BREAKFAST/LUNCH/SNACK: A healthy breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack will be provided each day. A menu calendar will be provided at the beginning of the summer.

ITEMS TO BRING EACH DAY: Sunscreen & Hat, **SNEAKERS**, Bathing Suit & Towel, Water Bottle, Extra T-Shirts & Shorts, Reading Book.

ADMINISTRATION: Feel free to contact Tara Tucker at (802) 236-4882 with any questions. You may also contact One Planet Director, Carrie McDonnell, with any questions at (802) 763-7775, ext 4 until June 29. July 1-August 2, Bill Bonsignore will assume the Summer Director position and can be reached at ext.5.

DROP OFF: Unless your child is attending **Early Bird** or **Night Owl hours**, campers should arrive at 8:30am and be picked up between 4:00-4:30pm. Notify Coordinator if your child will be arriving late or leaving early. Also notify Coordinator if your child will not be attending a certain day to help us plan ahead.

PARENT VOLUNTEERS: We are seeking parent volunteers to act as chaperones on our field trips & special events. Please let us know if you're willing to help!

ONE PLANET FIELD TRIPS & SPECIAL EVENTS

During weeks 2 & 3 participants will travel to the Upper Valley Aquatic Center daily for Swim America swimming lessons. If your child participated in the Swim America program last year, he/she will be placed in the proper level. New participants will be tested on the first day. All students will receive a skills mastered "report card" at the end of the 2 weeks.

During weeks 1, 4, 5 & 6, One Planet will take participants on field trips 1-2x weekly. This is usually a theme-based field trip on Fridays, and sometimes a half-day swimming trip. Please see *Weekly Theme Schedule* below for more information.

On **Thursday, August 1**, we invite all summer participants and their families to join us for a summer's-end cookout from 4:30-6:30pm. We will provide dinner & fun activities for the whole family. We will need parent volunteers, so please let us know if you are interested in helping! We will also gladly take food donations. Please help us any way you can with this special event!

NOTE: Program will end at 12pm on Friday, August 2nd.

SOUTH ROYALTON THEMES

June 24-28: Eco Kids

This place-based, ecology-focused program will introduce students to the study of local birds, including their homes and habitats. In conjunction with this, students will be working with local woodworker to build wooden bird houses. Through fun hands-on activities and lots of outdoor exploration, we hope participants will gain understanding and a deeper appreciation for these fascinating creatures living in their backyards, as well as knowledge for how to be responsible stewards of their local natural resources.

July 1-5: Passport

Let the journey begin! From Armenia to Zulu, take a whirlwind trip around the world discovering cultures, traditions, and customs of lands near and far. Through large and small group challenges such as Pipeline, Stepping Stones & Life with the Wright Family children will discover how communication, cooperation, different roles and leadership all contribute to accomplishing a task successfully while learning there really is no "I" in team! Step 1: Apply for Child Care Financial Assistance

To be eligible for assistance your family must:

- 1) Have an accepted service need (reason) for childcare; AND**
- 2) Meet current income guidelines (Gross monthly income not to exceed \$5,195 for 3 person family, \$6275 for 4 person family, \$7355 for 5 person family, \$8435 for 6+ person family).**

We ask any family that meets the above eligibility requirements to apply for Child Care Financial Assistance before requesting a scholarship. To apply, parents/guardians must contact the Family Place at 802-649-3268 or go to <http://www.familyplacevt.org/child-care/>.

Your camp registration will be considered incomplete until you have submitted a complete application to the Family Place and have signed below OR if you can provide evidence that your family would not be eligible for Child Care Financial Assistance.
